David had taken on an additional parish council's website, but was happy to continue to provide support as required. Gordon had contacted Cycling UK. They had confirmed that they were using the old PO Box address. Following the call, they had updated the address and had sent copies of the last two magazines. However, the address appeared to have been amalgamated with that of another cycling group. **WP** William to get this corrected. **Eling Way** 2. Funding secured for the Phase 1 extension within Hermitage village, including a link from the village hall to the new development behind Co-op, and onwards to Station Road. It was hoped that landowner and drainage issues could be resolved. For the section between Hermitage and Newbury, landowner issues meant that the preferred route could not be achieved, so an interim option being explored to upgrade the bridleway to the west of the B4009. The Public Rights of Way Team was supportive. The Local Access Forum was due to be briefed. For the section north of Hampstead Norreys it is hoped that the future route might run alongside a proposed flood defence scheme. 3. NCN4 The Canal and River Trust (CRT) had been contacted by West Berkshire Council regarding the potential to upgrade the Thatcham to Cranwells Swingbridge section. A meeting between the Council, CRT and Sustrans was planned for June. Paul had met with the Sustrans Volunteer Co-ordinator to discuss the Marsh Benham to Great Bedwyn section.

Additional counters would be deployed at new sites where it is felt that there are likely to be significant numbers of cyclists. A trial was being organised to demonstrate proof of concept.
